Literacy

In class, we will have weekly writing lessons linked to our topic of Fairyland. We will be focusing on different types of writing styles including; letters, instructions and posters. We will also try to use 'wow words', different sentence openers and punctuation in our writing.

Numeracy

This term our focus will be on money. We will be thinking about what we need and use money for, how we get money and adding different amounts of money. We will also be learning about measurement. We will be using different resources to measure the Giant's footsteps and our beanstalks.

We will be continuing with number processing work and encouraging the children to use their knowledge of addition and subtraction to explore larger numbers.

We will be using 'Big Maths Beat That' on a weekly basis to develop and extend our mental maths skills and challenge ourselves to beat our own best score.

Homework

Homework is handed out on a Monday and is due back to school on a Friday. Homework is a great way to share with you what we have been learning in class and the children can revisit and extend their learning.

Depending on your child's reading group, this will determine the day reading homework is sent home.
